

Down by the Creek Bank, the musical, was written in 1978 by Grammy and Dove artist Dottie Rambo. Dottie wrote many Christian songs including “We Shall Behold Him,” “I Go to the Rock,” and the Easter classic “Behold the Lamb.”

In the early 1980s, Jan McClure led the Children’s Choir at Cedar Spring Baptist Church. At the same time, Debby Byars was leading the Children’s Choir at Pacolet Mills Baptist Church. In 1982, the children at Cedar Spring Baptist performed *Down by the Creek Bank* for the first time. In 1984, the children at Pacolet Mills Baptist also performed this toe-tapping, heart-touching musical.

Fast forward to the year 2023. Debby and Jan began to pray about the musical that the Lord wanted the Morningside Kingdom Kids to sing in the spring of 2024. As the Lord heard their prayers, He placed *Down by the Creek Bank* in both of their hearts! It did not take much to convince Laura White that we should tackle this big musical. Laura also had performed the musical as a child in her home church.

There was one problem—the musical was out of print. Through multiple requests via Social Media, the Lord supplied books, listening CD’s, and an accompaniment CD for the Kingdom Kids.

Today, we believe the Lord has brought each of you here for a blessing. It is our desire that you let our Kingdom Kids lead you in worship as we present *Down by the Creekbank*, by Dottie Rambo and David Huntsinger.

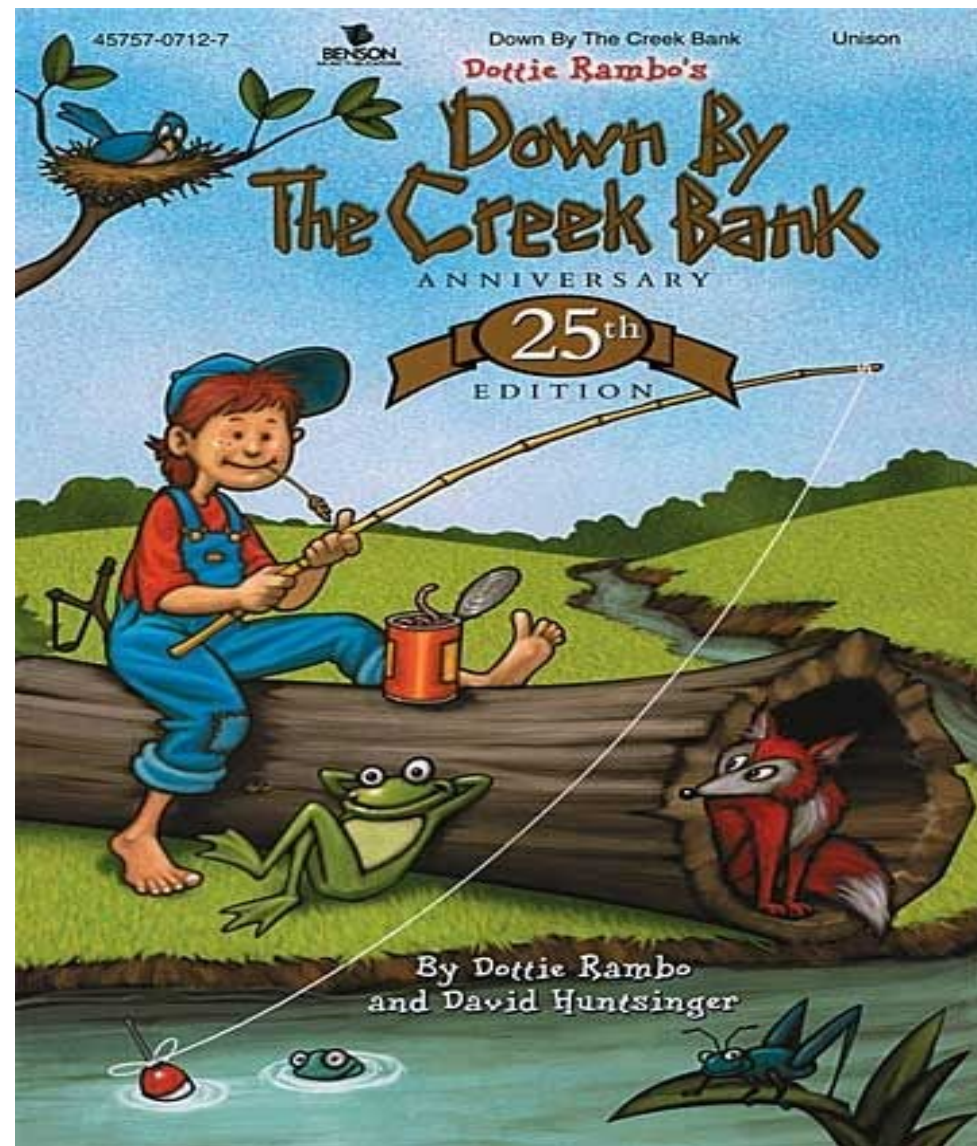
