Faith and Patriotism

As Christians, we understand that God's truth does not rely on any government, leader, or nation; but, His truth comes directly from God's own omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent nature. We know that our nation exists by the grace of God; and by that same grace, we are citizens of His kingdom first, and citizens of our country, second. We are grateful that God has blessed us by placing us in this time and place and seek to do His will in service to Him.

As we enjoy the Fourth of July and the coming days of summer, may we remember that we worship a God who reigns over us all. Let us seek His will and vision for our lives. May we show His grace and love to our community, state, and nation in order to glorify Him.


