

Words from Our Pastor

Dear Church Family,

In 1997, the film *Amistad* was released, inspired by the true events surrounding the Spanish slave ship *La Amistad* in 1839. The enslaved individuals aboard managed to seize control of the vessel off the coast of Cuba but were ultimately detained by a U.S. naval ship in American waters. This incident ignited an international legal battle that culminated in a landmark decision by the U.S. Supreme Court in 1841.

In the movie, the enslaved men face criminal charges of piracy and murder, but those charges are swiftly dismissed due to the circumstances occurring in international waters. However, this dismissal marks the beginning of a more profound struggle as the ship's owners file a civil suit, claiming the enslaved individuals as property and demanding their return. The defense attorney, Roger Sherman Baldwin, portrayed by Matthew McConaughey, grapples with deeply held beliefs and political pressures, all while struggling to communicate effectively with his clients.

Though they win the initial case, an appeal forces them to retry the matter. In a pivotal scene, Baldwin attempts to explain the situation through an interpreter. Cinque, the leader and spokesperson for the Africans, is confused, as he was previously assured they would be set free. Baldwin begins with, "What I should have said..." but is interrupted by the translator, who notes that the Mende language lacks a word for "should." Baldwin is baffled, but the interpreter simply explains, "You either do something or you don't do it!" This exchange has stuck with me for years.

As we study the book of James, I can't help but be reminded of this scene. Just recently, we talked about one of my favorite verses in James: Chapter 1, Verse 22: But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

This simple, yet profound concept, is both straightforward and challenging. The point is not that hearing is unnecessary or unimportant. Likewise, our intention or our "should" is important and plays a role in our overall direction. But, while hearing and intention do matter, they ultimately hold no value without action...I love the clarity of James' message and the call to respond actively to God's Word. It's not merely a matter of what we "should" do. In fact, I would like to remove "should" from my vocabulary as much as possible and simply be a doer.



We are very happy to inform all Morningside members that the long journey to sell the building located at 901 S. Pine St, known to many as the Caine Building, has been sold as of October 25, 2024. In accordance with yote that took place January 21, 2024

the congregational vote that took place January 21, 2024, the sale price was \$530,000.00.

The property, formerly occupied by Kids Club, was purchased by the Spartanburg-based company Palmetto Posting, Inc. The corporate team of nine will daily occupy the building, which will serve as their corporate office. The company works with local and state agencies to provide notices for delinquent tax, utility disconnections, and mobile home audits.

We worked closely with Andy Hayes, our agent, to find a buyer with a profile that would make for a long-term good neighbor, and we believe we have found just that! We look forward to developing a good relationship with Palmetto Posting, Inc.

Thank you, congregation of Morningside, for your support and patience as we took this journey. One hundred percent of the funds from the building sale will be used for building maintenance of the campus that makes up The Morningside Baptist Church.
