Letting the Shepherd Lead...

The church that perhaps supported Paul the most in the New Testament was the church at Philippi. In the book of Philippians, Chapter 1:4-5, Paul says that he is praying for the church there because of their "partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." He uses words like "fellow workers" and "true companion" in Chapter 4:2-3 when describing their combined efforts in the gospel. The end of Chapter 4 describes how thankful he was to the Philippians. They had shared in his trouble by sending him a gift. In Verse 18, he tells them that he is sure their cooperation is "a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God."

The spirit of cooperation shared between Paul and the Philippian church was one that united them in prayer, provision for needs, and partnership. As believers, we should encourage and welcome each of these types of cooperation. *Praying* together is a wonderful way to begin having a shared concern for one another and for what God wants. *Provision* happens when we see a worthwhile need for which we can help someone share a solution. *Partnership* can take the form of fellowship, or it could take the form of service. The point of partnership is sharing a common goal.

This month we have the opportunity to cooperate in many ways as a church. We can come together inside the church family to cooperate as small groups on Wednesdays. We can cooperate with nearby schools and colleges by finding ways to minister to the students through the Good News Club or College Colors Sunday. We will have the opportunity to give to South Carolina Baptist missions this month as we observe the Week of Prayer for State Missions and give to the Janie Chapman Offering. Later this month, we will hear about how we can cooperate with CUPS Mission to be on mission in the Dominican Republic. Perhaps the most exciting opportunity we have to work together is by participating in the Slavic Congregation's Harvest Feast held in our Fellowship Hall Sunday, September 17.

Cooperation begins with prayer. Cooperation becomes more serious when we seek to provide for the needs of others. Cooperation benefits others most when we partner together for the gospel. Let's strive to be more and more cooperative.




